Yield to Maturity: The rate of return anticipated on a bond if it is held until maturity date.

Effective Duration: A bond's sensitivity to interest rates, incorporating the embedded option features, such as call provisions. Bonds with longer durations experience greater price volatility than bonds with shorter durations.

Overview

The **Holbrook Structured Income Fund** seeks to deploy capital opportunistically across securitized credit. The Fund will generally be invested in four main asset classes within securitized credit: Collateralized Loan Obligations (“CLOs”), Residential Mortgage-Backed Securities (“RMBS”), Commercial Mortgage-Backed Securities (“CMBS”), and Asset Backed Securities (“ABS”). The flexible mandate across securitized credit allows the Fund to potentially tap liquidity from different areas to redeploy into opportunities that may present themselves. The allocation between each asset class will depend on the top-down macroeconomic view of the Adviser, relative value of each asset class, and opportunities that exist within CLOs, RMBS, CMBS, or ABS.

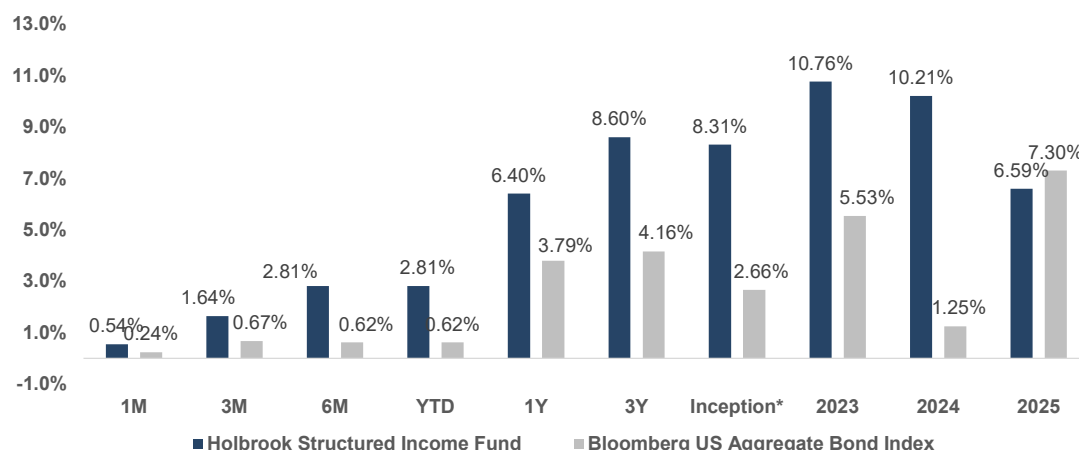

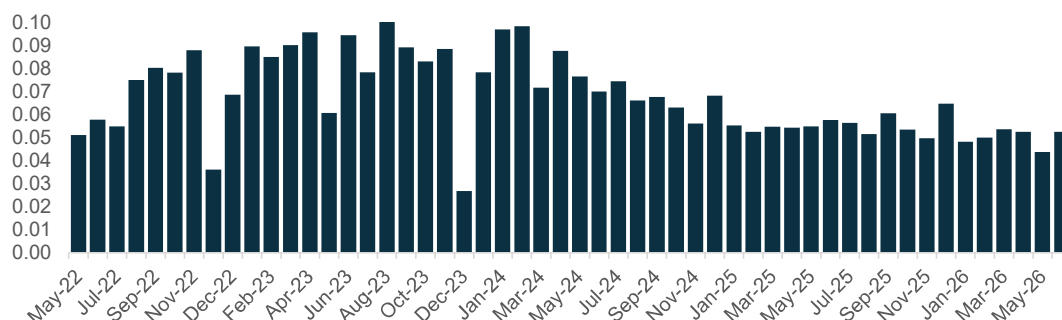

Gross expense ratio for Class I is 1.34%, Investor Class is 1.84% and Class A is 1.60%. There is a fee waiver until September 1, 2026, of 0.10% so fees will not exceed 1.75% Class A, 1.50% Class I and 2.00% Investor Class. Maximum sales charge imposed on Class A purchases is 2.25%

*The Fund's Adviser has contractually agreed to reduce the Fund's fees and/or absorb expenses of the Fund through at least September 1, 2026 to ensure that total annual Fund operating expenses after fee waiver and reimbursement (exclusive of any taxes, interest, brokerage commissions, expenses incurred in connection with any merger or reorganization, indirect expenses, expenses of other investment companies in which the Fund may invest, or extraordinary expenses such as litigation) will not exceed 1.75%, 1.50% and 2.00% of average daily net assets attributable to Class A, Class I and Investor Class shares, respectively. This agreement may be terminated by the Fund's Board of Trustees on 60 days' written notice to the Adviser. These fee waivers and expense reimbursements are subject to possible recoupment from the Fund in future years on a rolling three-year basis (within the three years after the fees have been waived or reimbursed) if such recoupment can be achieved without exceeding the foregoing expense limits as well as any expense limitation in effect at the time the reimbursement is made.

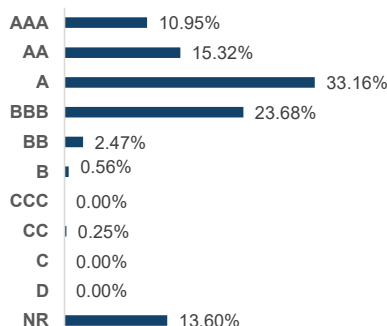

Ratings Breakdown

Bond Ratings: Bond ratings are assigned by a rating agency such as Standard & Poors, Moodys, Fitch, Egan Jones, KBRA, or DBRS. The ratings breakdown above utilizes ratings from all ratings agencies – depending which rating agency rated the bond deal. In the event that two rating agencies have rated the same bond deal, the higher credit rating is used.

Bloomberg US Aggregate Bond Index: The Bloomberg US Aggregate Bond Index is a broad-based flagship benchmark that measures the investment grade, US dollar-denominated, fixed-rate taxable bond market. The index includes Treasuries, government-related and corporate securities, MBS (agency fixed-rate pass-throughs), ABS and CMBS (agency and non-agency).

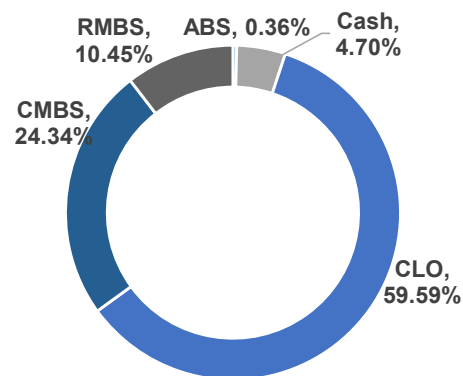

¹ The overall Morningstar Rating™ for the Holbrook Structured Income Fund was five stars among 87 Securitized Bond – Diversified Funds as of 6/30/2026 (derived from a weighted average of the fund's three-, five-, and ten-year risk-adjusted return measures). The Morningstar Rating™ for funds, or "star rating", is calculated for managed products (including mutual funds, variable annuity and variable life subaccounts, exchange-traded funds, closed-end funds, and separate accounts) with at least a three-year history. Exchange-traded funds and open-ended mutual funds are considered a single population for comparative purposes. It is calculated based on a Morningstar Risk-Adjusted Return measure that accounts for variation in a managed product's monthly excess performance, placing more emphasis on downward variations and rewarding consistent performance. The Morningstar Rating does not include any adjustment for sales loads. The top 10% of products in each product category receive 5 stars, the next 22.5% receive 4 stars, the next 35% receive 3 stars, the next 22.5% receive 2 stars, and the bottom 10% receive 1 star. The Overall Morningstar Rating for a managed product is derived from a weighted average of the performance figures associated with its three-, five-, and 10-year (if applicable) Morningstar Rating metrics. The weights are: 100% three-year rating for 36-59 months of total returns, 60% five-year rating/40% three-year rating for 60-119 months of total returns, and 50% 10-year rating/30% five-year rating/20% three-year rating for 120 or more months of total returns. While the 10-year overall star rating formula seems to give the most weight to the 10-year period, the most recent three-year period actually has the greatest impact because it is included in all three rating periods.

The Holbrook Structured Income Fund was ranked against the following numbers of U.S.-domiciled 87 Securitized Bond – Diversified funds over the following time periods: 98 funds (11th percentile) in the last one year, and 87 (9th percentile) funds in the last three years for the period ending 6/30/2026. With respect to these Securitized Bond – Diversified funds, the Holbrook Structured Income Fund received a Morningstar Rating of 5 stars for the three-year period, and no stars for the five and ten-year periods. ©2026 Morningstar, Inc.
